'WHAT WOULD YOU DO?' IMPACT BRISTOL 2020/21

Commissioned by West Country Crimestoppers, the What Would You Do? (WWYD?) Bristol project included a number of Bristol Schools taking part in a CPD session hosted by Unique Voice to learn about specific crime in Bristol communities and how they could creatively lead their students to highlighting these topics on film, demonstrating the power of the charity Crimestoppers.

Following this, the schools submitted a competition entry including their idea for a film exploring these topics creatively. The winning schools, Frome Vale Academy and Westbury Park went on to create their films with support from the Unique Voice creative team.

Once created the films were shown at a premiere event at The St Michael's Centre where we were joined by the families of the children involved in the project and various community members to celebrate the children's fantastic achievements as part of this project.


